## LAST REMINDER TO CHECK VOTER INFORMATION

County Durham residents are being reminded for the final time to check their voter registration information or risk losing their right to vote in future elections.

As part of Durham County Council's annual electoral canvass, final reminder forms are being issued to all households which have not yet confirmed their details.

Forms were initially sent to all properties at the end of July asking people to check that the information the council holds for them is accurate. This was followed up with door-to-door enquiries and delivery of a second reminder form where necessary.

The council is now issuing one final reminder for residents to ensure they are eligible to vote in upcoming elections. These include The Police and Crime Commissioner election and a potential election for the Combined Authority Mayor in May 2024, and the next UK Parliamentary General Election, which must be held before the end of January 2025.
