Wolsingham Methodist Church (22 Front Street, Wolsingham, DL13 3DD) will be offering a `warm space` as follows:



HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY – WARTIME STORIES

Holocaust Memorial Day marks the anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp in Poland on 27 January 1945. To commemorate, stories of a family's life in occupied Poland and the County Durham men involved in the liberation of Belsen concentration camp will be told during two free events.

The events, organised by Durham County Council to mark Holocaust Memorial Day (Friday 27 January), will feature talks from Durham University professor, Marek Szablewski, and military researcher, Steve Shannon. Professor Szablewski will take to the Gala Durham stage on Holocaust Memorial Day – Friday 27 January – to share the story of his family's life in occupied Poland during the Second World War.

The physics lecturer's father was a Polish resistance fighter, so his Jewish step-grandmother and aunt were hidden from the Nazis during the war. Since being awarded a Winston Churchill Memorial Trust Fellowship in 2011, he has been researching his family history and the journey that brought his parents to Yorkshire.

Professor Szablewski's talk starts at 10:00am and is expected to last around 1 hour and 45 minutes. The event will be supported by Belmont, Framwellgate and Durham Johnston schools which will provide music and performances. And from 6.30pm to 7.30pm on Thursday 26 January – the eve of Holocaust Memorial Day – military researcher Steve Shannon will deliver his online talk, 'Never Again, Never'. Hosted by The Story at Mount Oswald, Steve will tell the incredible story of the County Durham men who were involved in the liberation of Belsen Concentration Camp in April 1945.

Using the Durham Light Infantry archive and related collections, the talk draws on records that have only recently been catalogued, providing new insights into those tragic events. The talk will take place live via Zoom – advance booking is essential via the Events section of the Durham Record Office website at https://recordofficeshop.durham.gov.uk/pgEventResult.

Both of these events are free, but tickets must be booked in advance.

Durham Dales Parish Nursing is looking to employ 2 x NMC Registered Mental Health Nurses in paid positions to lead their new Parish Nursing Service. This innovative service is provided in partnership with Parish Nursing Ministries UK and aims to improve and maintain the wholistic health and wellbeing of local people.

The parish nurse role includes:

- General health education
- · Personal health screening, mental health support and referral
- · Advocating for individuals and mental health more widely.
- Acting as mental health navigator and resource
- Providing spiritual care
- · Leading the service alongside trustees and other staff
- Liaising with other local services and voluntary groups
- Supporting the wider health, safety and risk management of churches and congregations in the area.

Current registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) is essential and support for revalidation is provided.

The person will be required to undertake formal role preparation and to offer spiritual care and Christian prayer when requested (it is therefore a Genuine Occupational Requirement for the applicant to be a Christian).

JOB VACANCY DURHAM WILDLIFE TRUST – CONSERVATION OFFICER

Role: Conservation Officer (People for Nature)

Background:

This is an exciting new role within Durham Wildlife Trust's Conservation Team and is funded by Zephyr Charitable Trust. The successful candidate will be playing a vital part in delivering the Trust's ambitious new 2030 Strategy.

Over the course of the three-year fixed term contract, the role holder will:

- increase the Trust's capacity to deliver for nature's recovery through investing in people.
- work directly with conservation trainees and volunteers to develop their practical skills and knowledge.
- provide people with greater appreciation and understanding of nature's needs so that they are better able to take action to address its decline.

Location: Based out of Rainton Meadows (DH4 6PU) or Low Barns (DL14 0AG), the post holder will operate across the Durham Wildlife Trust region from Tees to Tyne.

TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES AT UTASS

Emergency First Aid at Work – Friday 3rd March (9am-5pm)

This is a one-day course suitable for work in a low-risk environment or where the first aider will be responsible for a small number of people. Continuous practical assessment is undertaken throughout the course, followed by a 10 question multi-choice test. On completion, the certificate is valid for 3 years.

BELIEVE HOUSING - KEEP WARM, KEEP WELL COMMUNITY FUND

believe housing have changed the direction of the grants scheme, so the cash can go directly to County Durham projects that address the rising cost of living. Affordable housing provider believe housing has temporarily closed its community grants scheme, so the money can be used for a new Keep Warm, Keep Well community fund.

Not-for-profit groups in County Durham can apply for £500 towards new initiatives, or to sustain existing activities, that will support people this winter. Community groups must meet certain criteria to receive a grant, but the range of projects the Keep Warm, Keep Well community fund can support is varied. For example, a grant could help pay for activities or refreshments at a Warm Space venue or food for a Christmas event, lunch club or meal delivery. Funding could help an organisation provide essential items for people at home, such as blankets, hot water bottles and flasks, or to offer energy efficiency advice. The money could be used to support a foodbank, clothing bank or community pantry, or help a group buy a community washing machine or fridge freezer.
